

If you look really really carefully you will see that there is a blur to the left of the white shoe, this is where the painter changed his mind and got rid of the other shoe




On the other side of the door are *the Linley Sisters*. Look at their panel to discover:

# Hunt for my little friend Putto and the Vase with Flowers




One of my other friends is sooooooo small you might never ever see him, ever!! But you can try if you want...


# Hunt for A Girl at a Window

## Find the mystery lion



This is a painting by the artist Veronese. The painting was much larger than this to begin with but it was cut up and now sections of the painting are all over the world.



When the painting was cut into sections, someone painted over the lion's head!!! He is now covered with paint but you should be able to see his outline. Draw his head back on and complete the rest of his body.



Now the last person I want to introduce you to is David. David comes from Roman times and he is in the painting called *The Triumph of David*.



His painting is in Gallery XII, which is Gallery 12 in Roman Numerals. It is also called The Lupton Room  
Can you find it?

The Romans used letters for numbers, for example

1 = I, 3 = III, 5 = V,  
10 = X, 22 = XXII

Now look closely at David, he is the one holding something on a stick. He is my good friend but urrghhh what is he holding?!!!!  
David!!!



Look carefully at the painting, there is a celebration happening.

Can you answer these questions with the correct Roman Numerals?

How many musical instruments are there?

How many people are pointing towards David?

How many babies are there in the painting?

What will you draw on David's stick? I hope it's not this disgusting!
